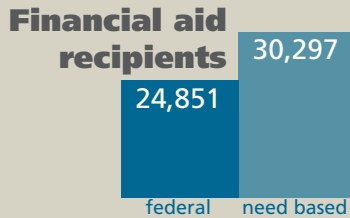

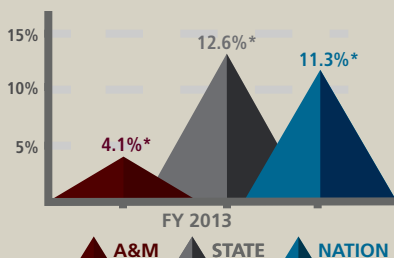

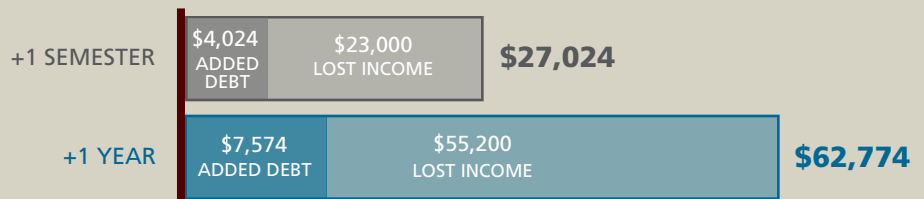

COHORT DEFAULT RATE

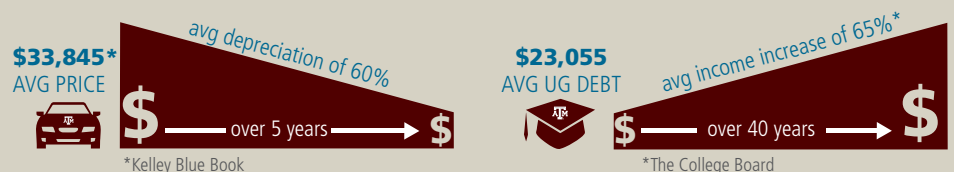
