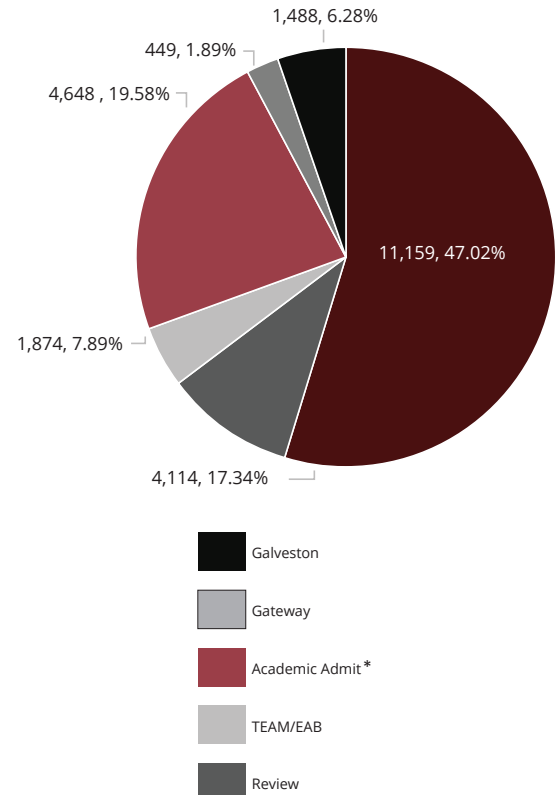

# FRESHMAN ADMISSION CATEGORIES

PROGRAMS	DESCRIPTION
<b>TOP 10%</b>	Rank in the top 10% of their graduating class and attend high school within the state of Texas
<b>ACADEMIC ADMIT*</b>	Rank in the top 25% of their graduating class and achieve SAT or ACT score minimums (Texas A&M does not superscore) - New SAT: Total score of 1360 or better with a minimum 620 Math and 660 Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (EBRW) - Old SAT: Total score of 1300 or better (Math and Critical Reading) with a minimum 600 Math and 600 Critical Reading - ACT: Composite score of 30 or better with a minimum 27 Math and 27 English
<b>HOLISTIC REVIEW</b>	Academic index of class rank and test scores, plus personal achievement and distinguishing characteristics.
<b>AGGIE GATEWAY TO SUCCESS</b>	A provisional admission program at Texas A&M University that is administered through the Transition Academic Programs. Gateway students are given a unique chance to gain full admission by taking summer courses and proving how well they can do academically.
<b>TEXAS A&amp;M BLINN TEAM &amp; ENGINEERING ACADEMY AT BLINN (EAB)</b>	Participating students are initially admitted to Texas A&M University on a part-time basis and may earn full admission by several methods. Students are enrolled in one academic course at Texas A&M each semester and the remainder of their courses at Blinn College. Students who complete 45 Blinn credit hours and 15 Texas A&M credit hours within a two-year period, while maintaining a 3.0 grade point ratio at each school, are automatically admitted to Texas A&M.
<b>ENGINEERING AT GALVESTON</b>	Provides students an opportunity to begin their engineering studies on the Texas A&M Galveston campus and to complete their engineering degree in College Station as part of the College of Engineering.
<b>HIGHER EDUCATION CENTER AT MCALLEN (HECM)</b>	Offers uniquely designed degree options specially tailored to meet the needs in the Rio Grande Valley. Students begin their college career at HECM and may change campuses after one year.

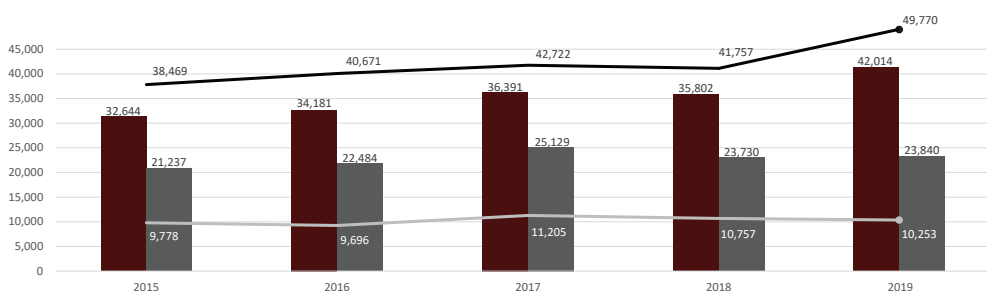
